
Welcome to Steve Bradford, new Website Administrator

Welcome to Interim Pastor Nancy Bancroft

(A portion of Nancy's letter to the Interim Search Committee)

Though I am not as yet an ordained minister my resume attests that I have had as much or

more religious formation, and academic theological preparation than many clergy. I have performed all of the duties of a pastor, except officiating at weddings. As a retreat director and parish volunteer I have experience in preaching, providing spiritual direction, leading communion services and other religious services. For years I have visited the sick, I have journeyed with people who are dying and led memorial services and committal services. In addition I am trained and experienced in helping groups transition.

Personally I feel that I am a natural leader, people generally find me warm and caring and I believe that I can hold the Union Church community together as it grieves the loss of Jan and prepares to receive a new settled pastor.

I don't know if God is calling me to serve at Union church as interim pastor. I do know that when Jen Comeau stated in church, "I know that we already have new pastor for Union Church there for us. We just need to find him or her", something stirred within me. I don't think that Tom and me coming to the church just as Jan announced her retirement is a coincidence. Nor is it a coincidence that I felt moved to resign my position with the Sisters of Mercy this summer. I feel an excitement at the possibility of this new spiritual endeavor, and drawn to put myself forward as a candidate, and at the same time I have some anxiety about following such a gifted and loved pastor as Jan. Still, I know in my bones that I am called to offer myself for the position."

Nancy and her husband Tom live with their delightful dog Jazz in Saco and look forward to bringing creative, efficient leadership during this time of transition. Nancy begins her ministry with us on January 18th, though she has already been attending meetings and getting onboard. Her first service of worship will be on January 24th. Welcome, Nancy and Tom!!
